# STARS & STRIPES CHANGES

During our class visit to the Stars and Stripes, we were told that the people in the production department are in the process of changing from "hot" to "cold" type.

Hot type is the use of metal casts to print the paper. The part of an article that is on a certain page is run through a special machine which makes a little metal cast of it. Then a man takes all of these metal parts, in-

other metal cast is then made from the mat, but it is in a semicircle shape so two will fit on the presses.

Cold type uses this same process up until the final metal cast is made. Instead of metal casts with raised print, a metal cast with very small indentations of letters on it is made.

Cold type improves the quality a little over that of hot type.

The change in type cannot be a complete one because very much money is invested in the hot type machine.

The Torch which is going to be used to light the eternal fire, is carried from the first Olympic site in Greece to the site of the Olympic games that year.

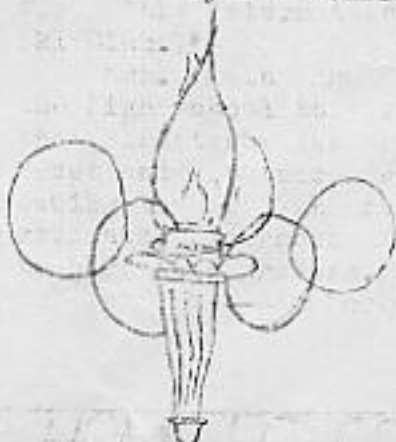
This year, as you probably know, is the year for the Olympic Games which will be held at Munich.

The festival had many people selling clothes, hats, food, drinks, posters, records, incense, cigarettes, jewelry, and drugs. There was an O.D. camp for people taking overdoses of drugs. There were three men having a mud fight in the nude and tons of people gathered around taking pictures. "Holy Islands" and "Jesus" were there passing around pamphlets saying "Jesus Loves You!" The Rhein River going around the island had many people swimming in the dirty water. The toilets were always full and you would have to wait an hour or so to use them. The clean water

Saturday afternoon, May 20, at 1:00 p.m., the rock fest got under way. By Sunday there was said nearly 100,000 people attended.
